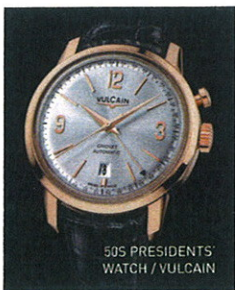

PRESIDENTIAL HISTORY

Swiss watchmaker **Vulcain** has an ongoing history with U.S. presidents dating back to 1947 and Harry Truman. Vulcain's innovative **Cricket** alarm calibre was the first wristwatch to successfully incorporate a miniature striking mechanism and was presented to Mr. Buck-Stops-Here and virtually every other American president since (it has been simply dubbed "the **Presidents' Watch**"). In celebration of this tradition, and of the general spirit of the 1950s, the company has released the **Vulcain 50s Presidents' Watch**. The look and feel of



the timepiece is very much inspired by the post-war years, but it houses Vulcain's newest self-winding movement, the Calibre V-21. Two barrels—one to deliver the energy required for the hours, minutes and seconds functions, and the other to power the 20-second alarm function as well as a balance oscillating at 18,000 vibrations per hour—and a 42-hour power reserve hallmark the technology of this classic timepiece (\$24,920 in rose gold).

MOUNTAIN SPA

The idyllic **Primland** resort in the Blue Ridge Mountains along the Virginia-North Carolina border now sports a relaxing spa as the perfect counterpoint to its many mountain activities. **The Spa at Primland** is not only large (over 8,000 square feet) and outfitted with *hammam*-equipped locker rooms and a glorious indoor pool, but many of its rituals are derived from the mountaintop's eclectic native heritage. Color and directional placement are based on a kind of American Indian *feng shui*, and the Indian medicine wheel and certain native stones play a part in the exclusive treatments. Try the two-hour **Shenandoah** facial, which offers a spectrum of exfoliants, masks and serums, as well as a neck and shoulder massage (\$210).
